Project background

The cities of Coburg, Eugene, Springfield, as well as Lane County, Lane Transit District, and the Lane Council of Governments are examining how different transportation and land use choices might affect our future. Through a process called "scenario planning", our region is looking at how to reduce greenhouse gas emissions while enhancing community health, economic development, and social equity. These scenarios will not bind local governments, change existing plans, or policy directions. However, through this process we may learn important lessons that will inform future land use and transportation planning.
