Food Pantry



The holidays always seem to be a time when food drives are popular. I am often asked what the food pantry needs, so I am enclosing a list of those items. These can be left in the donation barrel at the Coburg Dairy Mart in the post office area, or left with your mail carrier during the postal food drive on November 18th. Or you can call up 541-221-5055 to have donations picked up. The pantry will be open on the 2nd and 4th Mondays in November as usual, but due to Christmas, will be open on December 11th and 18th, and closed on December 25th. We will resume our normal schedule in January.

Needed items:

- Peanut butter
- Jams (not homemade)
- Salad dressings
- Ketchup
- Mayonnaise
- Olives
- Soups
- Vegetables other than corn and green beans (we always seem to get lots of these 2)
- Chili and other canned meals such as spaghetti, ravioli, etc
- Boxed dinners (Mac and cheese, rice-a-Roni, etc
- Boxed cereal

As you can see, almost anything!

We currently serve over 100 people from our community each month. We have over 20 volunteers that work a total of about 50 hours each month. We receive about 700 pounds of donated food from FFLC each month, and 150 pounds or more from our community. Thank you all for the support you give to fight hunger in our community! And please remember the postal food drive on Saturday November 18th!




