Mr. Anderson allowed volunteer firefighters that he employed to respond from work at the Truck 'N Travel complex. This was a significant resource for our community back then.



As is our tradition, there are several events planned to happen during the



Wildish recently completed the City of Coburg Waterline installation and the testing and tie-in to existing lines is expected to be completed before the Fourth of July holiday. The ADA ramp work is completed and minor punchlist work for the ramps is forthcoming. The contractor will continue to perform asphalt pavement repairs in preparation for the main-line paving. The pavement repairs are scheduled to be completed prior to the Fourth of July holiday. At this time, the contractor is planning on performing the main-line paving in Coburg the week of July 8th. In summary, the contractor will not be working over the holiday weekend and will ensure the work sites are cleaned and open for use. According to the current schedule, the substantial completion of work in Coburg is expected to be completed July 10th!



Disaster Preparedness

Life is a series of events and situations, most of which usually have some level of predictability.

Sometimes though, out of the blue, life can provide us with unexpected events and situations. Cars break down, people get sick, someone drives while texting – you get the idea. Humans have to deal with the fact that we can imagine a perfect world, but live in an imperfect one. It is probably not

possible to anticipate or prepare for all the unexpected things that life provides.

Sometimes people focus on emergencies that can happen that are truly historic and/or catastrophic in nature (like the future Cascadia earthquake) and they tune out the more mundane or familiar emergencies (like falling from a ladder or getting hurt cutting your lawn).

One fundamental of emergency planning is to focus on skills and tools that most emergencies will need. First aid kit and first aid training comes to mind.
Having flashlights and extra
batteries is another. Some extra
food and water is yet another
fundamental. Most emergencies
will unfold quickly, and although
outside help will arrive, often it
is the first 5 to 10 minutes where
we need to intervene and render
help. We usually are on our
own for those first moments of
the situation. Those factors in
emergencies appear constant.




Noxious Vegetation
