With input from so many of our community leaders, we are moving forward through the unknown and organizing our resources into a community power group that is building a recovery plan for the future of Coburg.

The City of Coburg, the Coburg Community Foundation, and the Coburg Chamber of Commerce, have been working together to determine where to place our combined resources to best help those in need in our community.

The Coburg Community Foundation is a relatively new resource to our community. It is a non-profit 501 (c)(3) agency. With this designation, they provide greater flexibility to access resources through donations, grants, and volunteers. This coordination and flexibility will help organize those that can help to assist those that need help. Beyond the emergency, the Foundation can continue to be a clearinghouse for garnering resources to support projects and programs throughout our community.

On April 21, the Coburg City Council voted to allocate up to \$50,000 to create an assistance program for businesses and households within the City of

Noxious Vegetation

Certain types of vegetation need to be managed to address health, fire, traffic, and overall visual impact to our community. It is considerate to maintain your property/adjacent right-of-way all year.

However between June 1st- September 30th, all



noxious vegetation must be maintained by the property owner including:

- Grass/Weeds more than 10 inches high
- Remove all poison oak/ivy & blackberry bushes that extend onto public property or across your property line
- Remove other vegetation that is a Health hazard

- Fire hazard because it is near other combustibles
- Traffic hazard because it impairs the view of a public thoroughfare or otherwise makes use of the thoroughfare hazardous
- Agricultural crops are exempt (unless a hazard)

Thank you for helping to keep Coburg safe and beautiful!

If the property owner is unwilling or unable to control noxious vegetation during this season, the City will abate such for a fee sufficient to cover the city's costs 10 or more days after the final publication of the notice and to charge the cost of doing so on any particular parcel of property to the owner thereof, the person in charge thereof or the property itself.

Utility Billing Assistance

Temporary Assistance

In April, City Council adopted a Resolution that



allows some relief for Utility Billing customers financially impacted by COVID-19. For more information and to find out if you qualify,

Annual Limited Income Assistance for Water and Wastewater

The City offers a reduced fee to income-eligible utility billing customers who live in the City Limits. If you are currently enrolled in the program you must reapply every year. Applications being excepted until June 30, 2020.

Coburg Community Assistance Program

In response to the Covid-19



crisis and rising concerns regarding the health and well-being of the entire

community including residents and businesses, the Coburg City Council has voted to allocate up to \$50,000 from the Economic Development Department budget to create a community assistance program in Coburg.

The Coburg Community
Foundation will act as
an impartial third party
administrator of this designated
assistance fund. Chamber
President Sharyl Abbaspour
will chair a selection committee
which will be tasked with
reviewing all applications and
awarding funds based upon a
selection criteria.

The intention of the City Council in making this allocation was to seed a Coburg Community Assistance Fund.

Individuals, businesses or other organizations that wish to donate to this fund should contact Leah Claypool, Board Chair of the Coburg Community Foundation, at coburgcf@gmail. com.

Business applications will be available starting on Friday, May 8th and will be taken through Sunday, May 17th. Once reviewed, awards will be disbursed within seven days of the selection process. Applicants must be a small business with 25 or less employees operating legally within the city limits of Coburg.

Individual applications will also be

available on Friday, May 8th and will be taken on an ongoing basis so long as funds are available. Criteria for applicant qualifications and on-line applications may be obtained at beginning on May 8, 2020.

It is the intention of all organizations involved that through the development of this fund, assistance continue far beyond the Covid-19 emergency to meet the needs of the community.

The parameters for the dispersal of this money will be refined by a committee with representatives from community organizations and the Coburg Food Pantry and Oregon community at large.

The grant program will be initially funded with \$25,000 and will be dispersed to qualified recipients. If further need is established, the remaining \$25,000 funding (for the total of \$50,000) can be distributed. (You can read more about this endeavor on page 9 of this newsletter)

The 2020 Census is underway - more than half the households across America have responded - and more are responding every day. Coburg's self-response rate is only 44%, while the state is 60%. Of course, the Census Bureau's goal is 100% response. Further, Coburg stands

to lose revenues if our census is not reported correctly; therefore, it's very important every citizen responds as soon as possible.
