As we move into spring my hope is building. We can see the end to many of the burdens of the pandemic. Running a government under the guidelines of the extreme rating in Lane County has been difficult. To me, holding "public meetings" while sitting at home in front of a computer defies the meaning of "public" in so many ways.

Technology has made the situation safer for all of us. I cannot say it has made it easier for us. I know there has been a steep learning curve for our Councilors and appointed officials on our committees and Planning Commission. Staff has done a great job of making this technology work for all of us. The staff has had to learn how to create the meetings then coordinate all of the participants and air it to the public. I suspect the most difficult part was, once they learned how to

do all of this, they had to teach a bunch of people that were stuck in the 20th century how to work in the 21st century!

In spite of the pandemic, nothing has slowed down in Coburg government.

Our future holds annexations, new development, and updates to many of our planning documents. Our finances are stable and we continue to move forward on many infrastructure improvements. The City acquired land for a third well, completed a bore under Interstate-5 that will be a conduit for utilities to the east side, and we are in the engineering phase of additional water system upgrades.

Pre-Registration and Scheduling an Appointment



If you haven't already done so, you can fill out Lane County
Public Health's pre-registration for vaccination, available to all members of the public by visiting lanecounty.
org/coronavirus. Pre-registration

will help create a centralized database to help health partners countywide contact those who wish to be vaccinated and schedule an appointment when they are eligible.

If you have a friend or loved one who does not have internet access, or has difficulty navigating the internet, we encourage you to help by assisting them in preregistering online. The contact information field on the form only requires email OR phone. If someone does not have an email address the field can be left

blank as long as a phone number is listed. If you are unable to complete the online form you can also preregister by phone by calling 541-682-1380 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, but please use the online form if possible.

You will receive an invitation from Lane County
Public Health when an appointment is available for
you to schedule. Remember to check your SPAM
folder for any scheduling messages. Please follow
instructions for your vaccine appointment and show
up on the date, time, and location as scheduled.

It is important to remember that Lane County will continue to follow Oregon Health Authority eligibility guidelines and the timeline to receive your vaccination will depend on supply.

The following weekend, on Saturday, April 24, bring back unused or expired perscriptions for safe disposal.




City Council to Consider Annexation Application



In 2017, the industrial Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) was expanded to take

in 107 acres on the east side of the I-5, just due east of Premier RV. At the time it was expected that the zoning for the industrial lands would be light industrial. The expansion was in response to the City's need to take in additional industrial lands to meet the state requirements of maintaining a 20year inventory of available lands. However, it was also in response to a regional need for employment related lands. The 107 acres is one of the largest properties available between Portland and Roseburg along the I-5 Corridor.

In September, 2020, the City



received an application from the UGB land property owner to be annexed into the City and thus opening up the ability to develop the property. In November, 2020, a related application for the rezoning of subject property was received. It is the owner's intention to sell the property to would be developers in lot sizes ranging from 20 acres up to the full property. No parcel may be smaller than 20 acres. The application specifically requests light industrial zoning.

Light Industrial allows for many uses including offices, medical facilities, retail products made on site, food products, furniture manufacturing, vehicle maintenance and repair, Trailers, Campers & Recreational vehicles, and a wide range of other uses. More information about Light Industrial zoning can be found in the Coburg Development Code which is available on the City website.

The Council and Planning
Commission held a work session
in October, 2020, to learn about
the process of annexation.
In December, 2020, the City
informally notified the properties
in the vicinity of the Urban
Growth Boundary by mail that an

application had been received by the City.

A second work session was held on February 23 to discuss the application and the specifics of the annexation agreement.

The City Council will consider the application which will be approved by ordinance. This will include two readings and a public hearing spread over two months. The zoning request for the property will be heard by either the City Council or Planning Commission and could include an additional public hearing.

These meetings will include the public ability to attend and provide comment on the subject. It is anticipated that these meetings will take place in April or May.

Coburg Police Update

Join the Coburg Police Department's S.C.R.A.M. Program

The Coburg Police Department Surveillance Camera Registration and Mapping Program (SCRAM) provides an opportunity for residents and business owners to help officers solve local crimes with the help of exterior video surveillance cameras. With the popular use of surveillance systems in communities across the U.S., video evidence has frequently helped officers develop leads and bring investigations to conclusion.

Participation in the program is voluntary.

How it Works

Using the geographic location of registered cameras, Coburg Police officers will be able to directly contact a registrant to determine if they have helpful, recordings should a crime occur near the registered surveillance system.

Registration

To register your exterior video security system, please visit the CPD Facebook page or website for the online form or download the registration form and return it in person or by standard mail the Coburg Police Department.

Disclaimer and Terms of Use

Working with the Coburg community to deter crime and promote public safety is the goal of the program. Accordingly, all camera registrants agree to the following terms and conditions:

- Registration is voluntary
- Registrant information will be used by the Coburg Police Department for official purposes.
- The Coburg Police Department may ask a registrant to check their recordings for a specific date and time should investigators determine the potential for video evidence in the vicinity of a registrant's surveillance system.
- Any footage containing or related to criminal activity may be collected by the Coburg Police Department for use as evidence during any stage of a criminal proceeding.
- Under no circumstances, will registrants construe they are acting as an agent or employee of the City of Coburg or the Coburg Police Department.
- Under no circumstances will the Coburg Police Department utilize any information obtained to access or view live recordings or feeds directly from cameras owned by registrants.

If you wish to withdraw from the program, please contact the Coburg Police Department at your earliest convenience.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will the department have access to my cameras remotely or be able to view the footage without my knowledge?

No, officers can only view the footage once a citizen has viewed it and chosen to share it with officers.

Will the department use or share my personal information for anything besides requesting footage?

No, the department will only contact you about your cameras if a crime or incident being investigated occurred near you. Your information will remain confidential.

Am I obligated to sign up for the program or turn over my footage? Do I have to pay a fee to sign up?

The program is 100% free and voluntary; you are not obligated to release footage, even if you sign up for the program. If at any time you decide to no longer be part of the program, you can contact the department and your information will be removed from the program.

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issue. Last year, the City Council was in the process of considering a Transportation Utility Fee (TUF) for street improvements when the pandemic struck. The Council tabled the discussion for one year. That year has passed, and we are preparing to discuss this fee again. The proposal assigns a small monthly fee to our utility billing in order to raise funds for street repairs. A key element of this plan was the voter approval of an increased gasoline tax. This would provide approximately \$80,000 additional revenue annually. Although \$80,000 a year will help, with well over a million dollars of repairs and rebuilds needed, the City would not be able to efficiently make any significant change to our street problems.

After work with consultants, engineers and input from citizens and a citizen committee, it was determined that a TUF was the best approach to raise the additional revenues needed to effect significant street improvements.

The work is ongoing, but staff is trying to build in savings by coordinating water main replacements with street rebuilds. Grants are already providing assistance. Many issues are popping up and are overlapping to other projects as we continue to upgrade our infrastructure. We are looking into street standards for storm water and pedestrian safety. Sidewalks and bioswales could create drastic changes to Coburg's streets and right-of-ways. The City has learned of many concerns with our development code and zoning ordinance. To respond to these concerns, the City Council created a Citizen's Committee that is charged with making recommendations for additions and changes to those documents (and possibly others).

Next month will complete five years of serving as

your Mayor. It certainly has been challenging. Five years ago, we had a deficit in our General Fund, had just moved into the



newly acquired City Hall building and we were still trying to finish the sewer system installation. A lot has changed in five years. It has been rewarding to be the leader of a community that gets things done. My tenure as Mayor has seen its fair share of contention and disagreement, but the reward has been working successfully with our elected and appointed citizens and a diligent, dedicated staff. Together we have accomplished so much, always with the mantra of keeping our small town safe and comfortable. I have worked very hard to provide every citizen an opportunity to give input freely and without intimidation. We cannot make everybody happy with our decisions, but I will continue to make sure City Council decisions are made with the presentation of all pertinent information and citizen input.

My thanks to the staff and the citizens of our community, especially the elected City Councilors, and appointed commissioners and committee members for your time and commitment to making Coburg government a unique and rewarding experience for me, and for keeping Coburg special.
