

Mayor's Corner **City Water System** Ray Smith, Mayor

Regular Mayor's Corner readers know that I usually write about upcoming issues in our city government. Today, I want to look back and share a success story of something we recently completed.

The city water system is a precious commodity. City Councilors and staff are keenly aware of the seemingly high price we pay to keep this system operating to provide Coburg with safe, clean drinking water and provide fire protection for our homes and businesses.

Over the last few years, the City of Coburg has invested about \$130,000 to install 579 new electronic water meters at every home and business. The cost includes a new billing software and extensive monitoring capabilities.

The most obvious impact of this new system is the hours of staff time saved from reading meters and working with the billing system. Public Works Director Brian Harmon says, "It

used to take two days for a Public Works employee to walk to every meter and record the meter reading for the monthly bill. Now all of the meter readings can be gathered in 30 minutes. Also, we have a huge decrease in time spent re-reading meters because of this, going from 15-20 re-reads a month to one to five."

The new software is able to download usage information from each meter that allows staff to alert users of possible leaks in their water system. With the cost of water, this has been a huge benefit to our customers. The efficiency of meter reading and accuracy of the auto read has cut down billing adjustments and time spent trouble shooting issues with customers.

Having all new meters also allows our Public Works team to more accurately measure our water consumption and compare it to our water production. This can help us monitor "lost water" which is usually indicative of leaks

Coburg Heritage Committee

At the beginning of November, the Coburg Heritage Committee will be honoring the Diamond House built in 1890, the NC and Rebecca Burns House built in 1894, and the Alice Batch House built in 1906 with plaques recognizing the properties historical significance in the Coburg community. Funding for these plaques was made possible with a Certified Local Government grant from the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office. This grant is offered to local communities across the state bi-annually.

The Heritage Committee is planning to award three more plaques in 2022 to the oldest buildings and sites in Coburg. Nominations can be made through May of 2022 and recipients will be celebrated at the 2022 Community Antique Fair. The goal of this program is to raise community awareness and generate support for the unique history within our local National Register Historic District.

Coburg Leaf Pickup Program

We want to get a jump on getting you involved with the Leaf Pickup Program this year. City crews will be starting on **December 13th** and working through late January. We will be working in zones again this year to pick up the leaves.

ZONE #1 is Pearl St. South and S. Willamette St. East

ZONE #2 is W. McKenzie St. South and S. Willamette St. West

ZONE #3 is Pearl St. North and S. Willamette St. East

ZONE #4 is W. McKenzie St. North and N. Willamette St. West

It is very important that you have piles ready to be picked up because we are only going through each zone twice. If you do not have your pile out to the right of way by **January 21st** we may not be able to pick up that pile. We also ask that you help us by following these simple rules:

1. Nothing but leaves! Please no branches, rocks, grass or trash!

2. Put piles where they can be reached safely!! They should be located in the right of way and not in the street.

3. Do not block the piles!! Please do not park in front of or near piles as crews will need to get to them easily!

If crews do encounter any of these issues, we will not be able to pick up your piles and it will be your responsibility to pick up the leaves. City crews will be working diligently to get the leaves picked up and will be as efficient as we possibly can!

The Coburg Police Department is accepting donations for its annual Shop with a Cop program. This is the 10th year the Coburg Police Department will be holding this event. The concept behind this program is for police officers to develop positive relationships with the underprivileged children in our community. The activity pairs up the children with police officers in a positive situation, such as shopping for Christmas presents. The officers get a chance to interact and begin building relationships with the kids while they help them select Christmas presents for their families. Each child will receive a \$125 gift card. After shopping they spend the rest of the afternoon wrapping presents and eating pizza together. Kids are selected by the Coburg Community Charter School.

CHETT Program Accepting Donations

The CHETT Program (Community Help Easing Troubled Times) is a funding stream consisting of monies donated by the community intended to provide resources to meet the short-term emergency needs of the most vulnerable in Coburg. Funds from this account are to be used for victims of crime, those displaced by crime or critical incident (including innocent family members of perpetrators), or people in the community with little hope or few options.

Examples of uses could include, but are not limited to: meals, lodging, transportation, crime scene damage repair, and/or other immediate short-term emergency assistance. A motel room for a victim of domestic violence and a new car part for someone stranded were provided by Coburg officers using CHETT funds.

This program was inspired by the Springfield Police Department and Coburg's Chief Larson received an unsolicited donation to the Coburg Police Department from a Coburg resident. A decision was then made to use the money to start a Coburgspecific CHETT program in the community. To keep this program robust, we need your support. in our water mains. Old meters can be notoriously inaccurate and an abundance of old meters made our system difficult to monitor.

As we continue with our capital improvement project to modernize and expand our water system, more efficiencies will be realized. Many of our underground water lines are up to 50 years old. We are replacing these to avoid expensive repairs and disruptions of service. In the next year, the city hopes to add a new well, a new elevated water storage tank, and finally provide city water to the East side of the freeway.

These improvements have been planned for years and the costs have been built into our monthly bills. This is part of the reason our bills seem so high. We consider future improvement costs as part of our billing consideration and the City Council reviews our utility billing annually. We have been very fortunate that our staff has been able to keep costs down through efficiency and smart moves like refinancing existing debt to lower interest rates. Inflation seems to be becoming a concern in our economy. The city will continue to do everything possible to keep our costs down while maintaining high quality and uninterrupted service to our homes and businesses.

I am hearing lots of discussion on holiday events in our community. **Keep an eye on social media and public postings for times and dates.** We are all hoping we can get back to a more normal life this holiday season. I hope we can enjoy some community events and celebrate the holidays together.
