Mayor's Corner Election Time

2022 has been a very busy year for the Coburg City Council. The normal schedule for meetings is once a month, on the second Tuesday of each month. We have had several months with extra meetings to deal with many issues. Two of these issues have been referred to Coburg voters in November for a decision.

The first referendum is regarding the production and use of psilocybin in Coburg. State statute has created a mandate for cities to decide whether they want to allow the use of psilocybin products in their jurisdiction, and if so, whether the city wants to create their own regulations beyond what the State of Oregon will create.

Essentially, the city had three choices:

1. Agree to allow the use and production of psilocybin products in our city and be able to further regulate this beyond the state guidelines.

- 2. Implement a two-year ban, which would allow the city to wait for the state to create the regulations and then the city can decide whether to allow psilocybin use or to ban it completely.
- 3. Implement a total ban.

The new state law requires the council to refer one of these choices to the voters for approval. Coburg City Council chose to refer the two-year temporary ban, given that there was little citizen involvement in the discussion and the state has not completed the rules for administering this issue.

The important aspect of this referendum is the fact that if the voters say no to this referendum, we will have to operate under the State of Oregon statute and administrative rules, which allows the production and use of psilocybin products.

The second referendum is an updated City Charter. City Council has referred to the voters a new City Charter. The

Coburg United Methodist Church Update

When the congregation of Coburg United Methodist Church closed in 2021, denominational and area leadership resolved that the building should continue to be an asset to Coburgers. Just in new ways.

Oregon Constitution allows City voters the right to adopt, amend, and revise the home rule charter. The Charter grants legal authority to the city and sets duties. Coburg voters adopted the most recent revision to the Charter in 1992. Many charter provisions are outdated and hinder effective and efficient municipal operation. The proposed 2022 Coburg Charter largely follows the League of Oregon Cities 2018 model charter. Among other things, the proposed Charter will add the City Administrator as an officer, clarify the responsibilities of the officers of the City, update the responsibilities of the Mayor and Council, update how vacancies are filled, and clarify what consists of a quorum.

4. Shall the City of Coburg declare a temporary ban on Psilocybin-related businesses and the manufacture of Psilocybin products?

Psilocybin is a psychedelic drug found in certain mushrooms. State law allows operation, manufacturer, distribution, and possession of psilocybin and psilocin. State law provides that Coburg may adopt a measure to be referred to the voters to prohibit the establishment of any registered or licensed activities. The Oregon Health Authority has initiated a rulemaking process to implement the state's psilocybin regulatory program and intends to begin accepting applications for psilocybin-related licenses on January 2, 2023. This measure would add a two-year moratorium for the establishment of operations of psilocybin-related businesses within the City's jurisdiction. The Oregon Health Authority has not completed the rulemaking process to implement the state's psilocybin regulatory program. The City Council believes that prohibiting psilocybin product manufacturers and psilocybin service centers within the city's jurisdictional boundaries to enable the adoption of the state's psilocybin licensing and regulatory program to allow the city to have reasonable time, place, and manner to adopt regulations is in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the people of Coburg.

Pavilion Park Plaza

The Park and Tree Committee worked with engineers on a conceptual design to upgrade and expand Pavilion Park. This design was presented to the Oregon Parks & Recreation Department during their annual Local Government Grant competitive process. The City has been recommended for a full award of our request for this project, and it will be approved in September. The park upgrades will include ADA compliant restrooms and parking, pathways, picnic areas, a water feature, benches, and landscaping. The preliminary design of a plaza reflects public space that is inclusive and accessible to all. More information to come on the final design and public input process and construction of the project.
