Nancy Bell, Mayor

As many of you know, as Council President I became Acting Mayor when Mayor Smith was unable to complete his term. I had the good fortune to work closely with Mayor Smith and other council members for the last 6 years. During that time, I have learned much about the complexities of city government and have come to appreciate the uniqueness of Coburg. During the transition from councilor to council president to acting mayor to mayoral candidate and finally to mayor, I have been humbled by the support and well wishes of this community-thank you to all who helped spread the word of my decision to run for mayor and to all who wrote my name on the ballot! As your mayor, I will do my best to always keep what is best for Coburg in mind as we approach new challenges in the new year.

2022 was a very busy year for the Coburg City Council and I expect 2023 to be a continuation. We have water projects, pavement preservation, new sidewalks to improve safety of pedestrians, new housing construction and street changes. There will be continued opportunities for you to share your ideas as we move forward. The normal schedule for City Council meetings is once a month, on the second Tuesday of each month, but we often have extra meetings to deal with important issues. Community members are encouraged to attend- council loves to hear your concerns and opinions-you are what makes Coburg so special!




HOW ARE ALLEYS BEING USED IN COBURG?

Citizen Questions, Concerns, and Complaints

Citizens who have questions, complaints, or concerns regarding something they have witnessed or are experiencing often contact the City of Coburg. We have provided information below to help assist you in addressing your questions and concerns.

City Ordinances

A city ordinance is a type of authoritative law, rule, or regulation made by a city government, as opposed to a law made by a state, province, or national government. It is intended to address issues of local concern, and typically applies to people subject to the city's jurisdiction. Examples of ordinances within the City of Coburg are:

- Nuisance Ordinance (Noxious Vegetation, Junk, Pollution, Odor, Attractive Nuisances, Hazards)
- Noise Ordinance
- Dog Ordinance

When a citizen experiences something they feel the City should be aware of, they can fill out a Citizen Inquiry Form. When received, these forms are logged, and then circulated to the appropriate department in the City. City staff then investigate the incident and respond to the person who has filed the Citizen Inquiry Form. If a violation is occurring, City staff will contact the violating party and will likely first provide a friendly reminder and education on the City Ordinance that governs the circumstance. If there is a reoccurring violation, the City has the ability to fine the party in violation.

Public Safety Concerns

Concerns regarding the safety and health of citizens should be reported as soon as possible. Non-emergency complaints and concerns may be reported by visiting the Police office at City Hall or by calling the nonemergency number at 541-682-7853. This is a non-emergency number that can be called 24 hours a day. When you call this number and get the recording, you may choose to leave a message or you can choose for your call to go to dispatch. Dispatch is a 24-hour service and will notify our department of your call.

Example of a concern:

"My neighbor is having a loud party on a Saturday night. It is now 1:00 am and the party is very loud."

What should I do? Call 541-682-7853 and choose "dispatch".

More serious concerns such as imminent danger to an individual, or concerns considered an emergency incident should be reported by dialing 911. The Coburg Police and/or Coburg Fire will be dispatched to the scene of these emergencies.

Noise Complaints

Noise is governed by the City's noise ordinance. Complaints are hard to



follow up on if they are reported days or even hours after an occurrence. Reporting the complaints while the noise is happening, or soon after, makes it easier for the City to respond.

Air Quality Complaints

Clean air is an important component to a healthy community. LRAPA accepts, records, and investigates air quality complaints throughout Lane County. They respond to industrial complaints, fireplace and wood stove complaints, outdoor burning complaints, asbestos complaints, and more. LRAPA inspectors and compliance officers respond to complaints during business hours: Monday-Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Citizen Assisted Radar Enforcement (C.A.R.E) Program

One of the most frequent requests or complaints made to the Coburg Police Department is for speed enforcement and speeding automobiles. The Citizen Assisted Radar Enforcement Program (C.A.R.E) has been established to meet the needs of our community members.

The C.A.R.E program contributes to public awareness by involving the public in recording vehicle speeds to determine if a speeding problem exists. Once this is done, the Police Department can focus its resources to address the problem. The goal of the program is to engage members of the community in addressing issues involving speeding autos in their neighborhoods.

We would like to offer a Citizen Assisted Radar Enforcement Program Class but need at least two (2) people who are committed to attending the 2 hour training class in order to offer the program.

- Determined the production and use of psilocybin. You chose to implement a two-year ban, which would allow the city to wait for the state to create the regulations and then the city can decide whether to allow psilocybin use in clinical areas or to ban it completely in Coburg. This time allows us to determine how best to manage this substance in our town once the state guidelines are finalized.
- Approved a new City Charter, which is essentially the constitution of the city. The last update to this very important document was done in 1992. Since then, our city and many state laws have changed to make many parts of the existing charter obsolete. The new charter removes old confusing verbiage on the description of a quorum and clearly defines the roles of our executive officers.

We will miss Mayor Smith, his smile, his kindness and dedication to Coburg, but because of his leadership the city government has continued without disruption and is in a good position to move forward with new leadership. We have a solid knowledgeable City Council; our staff is committed to excellent service with efficiency and integrity and we have passionate and involved citizens. The future of Coburg is in good hands.

I hope you enjoyed the holiday season and are ready to celebrate all the good times yet to come.
