# Noxious Vegetation Enforcement - June 1 - October 30

It's that time of year again! The sun is shining which means the grass and weeds are growing!


**REMINDER!** City's Ordinance states: "Between June 1 and October 30, no owner or person in charge of real property shall allow noxious vegetation on the property or in the right of way of a public thoroughfare abutting the property."



#### **Noxious Vegetation includes:**

- Weeds and grass more than 10 inches high.
- Vegetation that is, or is likely to become, a health hazard, a fire hazard, or a traffic hazard because it impairs the view of the public thoroughfare, or otherwise makes use of the thoroughfare hazardous.
- Poison Oak, blackberry bushes, bamboo, or ivy that extends into a public right-of-way.

# **Park & Tree Committee - Pruning Cuts**

Spring is here and it's a great time to enjoy the city parks! With the increase of park space in our community, the need for help to maintain the parks also increases. THANK YOU if you have participated in a work party, pulled weeds while visiting the park or picked up trash during a walk!!



# **Slow Down in Coburg!**

Recently, many community members have expressed concerns over speeding vehicles and crosswalk safety in downtown Coburg. The City is taking action to address the safety concerns, including but not limited to, placement of the speed trailer to monitor and record traffic data and alert drivers of their speed, establishing a transportation discussion group, and developing a Slow Down, Coburg campaign in collaboration with the Safe Lane Transportation Coalition (SLTC). The SLTC has provided "Slow Down Neighbors Ahead" yard signs which are available to be picked up free of charge at Coburg City Hall.

The Safe Lane Transportation Coalition will also be putting on a FREE Oregon Friendly Driver training course at the IOOF Hall on May 18 from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM. The Oregon Friendly Driver training course is a free, 60-75 minutes presentation that aims to make Lane County safer, by educating people who drive, on how to properly share the road and be mindful of all road users. Participants will also have the chance to win prizes during the training course. Prizes include gift cards to Dutch Bros, Papa's Pizza, Lithia, and more.

In 2020, the most recent data available, there were 23 fatal and serious injuries in Lane County due to people driving a vehicle and striking someone riding a bike or walking. Speeding was a leading cause in these crashes. Slow down, it can save a life!



## Coburg Council Discussion on Alleys and Right-of-Ways in Coburg

The City Council has been discussing alleys and right-of-ways (ROW) in Coburg for about a year. A public survey was conducted regarding the use of the alleys and the Council held discussions at work sessions as well as the City Council retreat.

- An Alley is a public or private way permanently reserved as a secondary means of access to abutting
  property. It is a public right of way shown on a plat which provides secondary access to a lot, block, or
  parcel of land.
- **Public Right-of-Way** (ROW) means territorial limits of any street, avenue, road, or way that is for any highway purpose under the jurisdiction of the city and is open to public use.

In Coburg, there are multiple properties out of compliance due to encroachment in the alleys and/or right-of-ways. This includes buildings, fences, garden sheds, garages, debris piles, junk, vehicles, etc. Some of these encroachments date back several decades, and therefore present a complicated answer to how to bring property owners into compliance. Additionally, there are property owners who dump their garden refuse and junk in the alley, which is against the City Ordinance and creates a cost to the City and taxpayers for the clean-up efforts of our Public Works team.

Right-of-Ways abutting the public streets creates another challenge as many properties have built their landscape out into the right of way by planting lawns, trees, shrubs, etc. When the City plans to widen, change, or provide preservation and/or maintenance to a street, a property owner may face removal of their landscaping. Additionally, utilities are in the right-of-way. Often, property owners are surprised to see paint on their front lawn due to a locate requested for a utility. In these cases, property owners should be aware that their lawn is most likely in the right-of-way, and therefore, is subject to the work of the City when work needs to take place.

The City will begin a public education campaign regarding the use of alleys and right-of-ways including letters to property owners abutting alleys. Properties who are out of compliance and encroaching in the alley can also expect a letter in the near future.

The City Council understands that encroachments are an existing problem that can date back decades, and therefore, there is not a short-term solution. However, property owners need to be aware that at any time the City plans work, either in the alley or right-of-way, it may require that structures be removed. Additionally, the City will be much more proactive in avoiding additional encroachments in the future by not allowing unlawful obstructions in the alleys or right-of-ways.

- We can't distribute any food that is opened or outdated.

You should be getting a note in the mail soon asking you to leave food by your mailbox. If you have a mailbox in the Dari Mart, please leave your bag of food in the Food for Lane County barrel in the Post Office.

- Crackers
- Jam
- Oil (no family sized bottles please)
- Canned meals Spaghetti-Os, Ravioli, etc.

into June. This is a very busy time for the volunteers serving on the budget committee, staff and City Council. It is time for us to evaluate the needs of the community and pair them with the anticipated resources, and just like at home there are often compromises as "wants" are weighed against "needs". We are fortunate to have such dedicated teams of staff and the community involved in making these decisions.

Changes around Coburg continue with the major water infrastructure project involving Coleman Street nearing completion and other street and water projects to the north of town ramping up. I understand these projects are disruptive to our neighborhoods and your patience is appreciated. A big thank you to our Public Works staff for coordinating the projects and doing a great job communicating with citizens to ensure a smooth flow of work and minimize disruptions.

Periodically people ask why we have an independent water/sewer system in Coburg-wouldn't it be easier or cheaper to have aligned with a larger system like EWEB? I'd like to briefly address those questions.

- 1. Coburg did consider joining a larger system, but the cost to hook up to an existing system was considerably higher than establishing our own system. Not only was the cost higher, to hook up the costs had to be paid in advance, which simply wasn't an option for us.
- 2. I have also been told by others who worked on the initial project that larger systems weren't interested in having us join their infrastructure.
- 3. In more recent years we have been told that in

case of utility disruptions, the Eugene/Springfield areas would be served first, potentially leaving Coburg without drinking water or waste disposal.

4. Being dependent on an organization with no ties to our community seems to be contrary to the fierce independent Coburg spirit!

Regarding our police coverage, you may have heard that Chief Larson is working part-time in Junction City. He was asked by regional law enforcement authorities to temporarily cover an unexpected administrative vacancy. We were able to honor this request because we have two full-time officers with the necessary experience and credentials to cover the duties of Chief of Police for 10 hours a week as well as enough reserve officers to cover open shifts. There has been no change in law enforcement coverage, and we continue to appreciate the dedicated service that our officers provide to Coburg and neighboring communities.

We know that change is inevitable but that doesn't make it easier for us to accept. Some days it feels like too many things are happening to keep up with, but then I walk around my neighborhood and our community and see kids playing in the parks, friends chatting in the street, and I'm greeted with waves and smiles as I pass. In this rapidly changing world, its great to live in Coburg, where people still are engaged in local activities and look out for neighbors. I'm grateful to be part of Coburg and I hope you are too!
