Mayor's Corner - Growing Pains

It's been an eventful few months and weeks. On August 13th, the City Council voted to join with Lane County and the State of Oregon in moving forward with a Strategic Investment Program (SIP) application for Materne North America, part of the Groupemom, owned and operated since 1854 in Boué, France, and the makers of the widely popular GoGo squeeZ applesauce products.

The SIP is an economic incentive program that exempts a portion of large capital investments from property taxes for a fifteen-year period. With the SIP, Coburg can be competitive with alternate industrial sites—all of which are in Enterprise Zones.

Moving forward with the SIP application is an important first step in bringing Materne's state-of-the art manufacturing facility to Coburg. There is much yet to be done, but we're optimistic. Materne, with its agrarian roots, commitment to

organics, and community values is a good fit for Coburg.

On August 27th, however, the City Council voted to affirm the early decision of the Planning Commission to deny the application of Love's Travel Stops & Country Stores to build a Love's facility on North Coburg Industrial Way, across Pearl Street from the Shell Station and diagonally across the street from the future Serenity Lane treatment center. The City Council carefully reviewed the submitted documentation, listened at length to all parties, and in the end, agreed with the Planning Commission that the application did not meet the locational design standards in the Zoning Code.

Love's appears to be a wellmanaged company that provides economic opportunities for many communities. Love's also says
