This does not automatically mean the individuals involved have COVID-19; it is common practice to wear personal protective equipment on calls to ensure responder safety and to protect the individuals involved, regardless of the illness or virus. We will continue to monitor the situation and make changes to our response protocols as needed.

In addition, we ask the public to limit visits to the fire station for your safety however; emergency operations will continue as normal. The Board of Directors and Officers of Coburg Fire District are incredibly proud of the dedicated Volunteers who continue to respond to emergencies, knowing they are facing a potential threat. These Volunteers continue to work their day jobs and respond to various emergencies in their free time.


